2019 Legislative Session

- [1] **CAP Action-Supported: Do-Not-Resuscitate Orders; Minors; Parental Consent (HB 2122)** — Requiring parental notification before a do-not-resuscitate order is placed on minor's medical chart. **Passed Senate 29-0-1. Passed House 58-0-2. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on April 30, 2019.**
- [2] **CAP Action-Opposed: Ratification of Equal Rights Amendment (SCR 1009)** — Procedural vote to bring SCR 1009 to the floor in support of ratifying the ERA, which likely would enshrine abortion rights into the U.S. Constitution. **Failed to Pass Senate 13-16-1.***
- [3] **CAP Action-Supported: Appropriations; Direct Services; Referrals (HB 2759)** — Funding for Family Health Pilot Program, a program to support childbirth as an alternative to abortion. **Failed to pass Senate 15-14-1. (Sixteen votes required for Senate passage.) Passed House 31-29.**
- [4] **CAP Action-Supported: Family College Savings Program (SB 1349)** — Adding K-12 private school tuition as a qualified expense for the 529 education savings plan. **Passed Senate 16-10-4. Passed House 31-28-1. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on May 22, 2019.**
- [5] **CAP Action-Supported: Pornography; Public Health Crisis (HCR 2009)** — Concurrent resolution declaring pornography a public health crisis. **Passed Senate 16-13-1. Passed House 32-28. (Action by Gov. Ducey not required.)**
- [6] **CAP Action-Supported: Postsecondary Institutions; Free Expression Policies (SB 1069)** — Clarifying that public universities and colleges may not restrict student free speech, unless the restrictions are constitutional. **Passed Senate 29-0-1. Passed House 60-0. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on April 10, 2019.**
- [7] **CAP Action-Supported: Procedures; Nomination Petitions; Registered Circulators (SB 1451)** — Initiative and referendum reform requiring additional accountability for ballot measure circulators. **Passed Senate 16-10-4. Passed House 31-29. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on June 7, 2019.**

2020 Legislative Session

- [8] **CAP Action-Supported: Abortion Data; Survivors Act; Supporting (SCR 1029)** — calling upon the U.S. Congress to enact both the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act and the Ensuring Accurate and Complete Abortion Data Reporting Act of 2019. **Passed Senate 16-9-5. Did not receive full House vote due to COVID-19-related recess.**
- [9] **CAP Action-Supported: Appropriations; Direct Services; Referrals (SB 1328)** — Funding for nonprofit organizations for services for healthy childbirth as an alternative to abortion and for a statewide information and referral system for community services while prohibiting referrals for abortions or to abortion providers. **Passed Senate Appropriations Committee 5-4 on February 4, 2020. Did not receive full Senate vote due to COVID-19-related recess.**
- [10] **CAP Action-Supported: Empowerment Scholarships; Qualifications; Administration; Appropriations (SB 1224)** — updating the ESA statute to ensure greater transparency, education, and administration of the ESA program and to provide increased benefit to students and families. **Passed Senate 16-14. Passed House 31-27-2. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on March 20, 2020.**
- [11] **CAP Action-Supported: Schools; Parental Rights; Posting (SB 1061)** — Requiring the Arizona Department of Education to create and post on its website a statutory handbook of parental rights. **Passed Senate 30-0. Passed House 47-13. Awaiting action by Gov. Ducey as of May 26, 2020.**

*Senators Kate Brophy McGee, Heather Carter, and Michelle Ugenti-Rita co-sponsored SCR 1009 Ratification of Equal Rights Amendment. Senator Ugenti-Rita was also the prime sponsor of SCR 1006 Ratification of Equal Rights Amendment with Senator Carter as a co-sponsor.
